






During our **certificates ceremonies** held on the 18th and 25th of November 2022, 66 children in Nomzamo and 80 children in Smartie Town received their certificates. On this big occasion the next young Halli Club leaders were elected.

The Sponsorship Program Unfortunately, it has come to an end, and we are grateful for the 3-year partnership we had. This was for the 7 children in Smartie Town and 6 children in Nomzamo.

Halli Leaders Club

Kobus Massyn, started Halli Leaders Club's on Mondays before Halli Club on Friday's. Our aim is to focus more on leadership skills with our Leaders.

Reading Clubs

About 20 children from Nomzamo and 10 children from Smartie Town attended the weekly clubs. The children loved the time spent with our volunteers, Lucatia Mdungwana, and Gerda Isaacs. Our Libraries offers a variety of books to read, from fiction to non-fiction.

Homework Clubs

About 20 children from Nomzamo and 10 children from Smartie Town attended the weekly clubs. With the help of our volunteers, Mandy Scott, Baby Girl Mpiko and Gerda Isaacs, our homework clubs are a safe, supportive, and productive meetup place for children who do not have the help they need with homework.

Needlework Club

Needlework Club is every Friday morning during the school term.

From March to May 2022, 6 ladies on average attended. Our needlework mentors were Leonie Taljaard, Eve Breebart, Cheryl Nortje. Through their time and effort, they made: Skirts, tops, fleecy tops, jackets, T-shirts, tracksuits and dresses.

From June 2022, our new mentor, Lynn Merry started. 7 Ladies attended and with all the material that was donated, they could make skirts, dresses and tops. Lynn is also teaching the ladies to make various items out of 1 basic pattern. We were able to buy 6 new sewing machines and needlework equipment. Lynn has restructured the Needlework club.

Needlework Representative Helen Jonkers is doing well with her shop she sold a lot of items this year.

Rehabilitation and Caring of Animals

The children were over the moon of excitement to see Halli our cool Mascot on the bike, this was so special for all of us, what a super Friday! Thank you to the awesome Bikers, the staff of Gloria Botha School and most of all the children!

Chase - Saw Halli at a Halli Visit at his school and he could not stop talking to his mom about how awesome Halli is and what we do, that it inspired his mom so much that she got her company involved and they blessed us with a financial donation

Community Involvement

Gloria Hungana - Community Representative in Nomzamo/Lwandle/Zola visited Gogo Sylvia in Nomzamo. She was delighted with all the nappies, ointment for bedsores, fan, chocolate Steri-Stumpi, and groceries we bought her (that is easy to eat). Gogo Sylvia is a fragile paralyzed lady. At our visit with Gogo Sylvia, Gloria gave her from the steri-stumpi and she loved it. Her

gratitude really touched our hearts as she could not stop thanking us. Gloria and she sang together as she missed it so much to go to church and be with other friends. Sadly, shortly after she passed on. Our prayers and condolences were with the family. It was such an honor to have known such an awesome woman!

Gloria Hungana – Community Representative in Lwandle/Nomzamo/Zola was walking home when she saw **Manyawuza** and her daughter collecting tins in the street. Gloria spoke to her and asked her why she was collecting tins and she said that she was not working, and she is collecting tins to support her and her daughter. Manyawuza was just about to cry when we gave her groceries.

We received a big financial donation for groceries. This was amazing and we could buy groceries for many families.

Gloria Hungana – Community Representative in Lwandle/Nomzamo/Zola, after we received a desperate letter from a little girl of our Halli Club Nomzamo. Gloria assessed the **Nogqala family**, and she saw the needs of the family. Single mom, without work, and her two children received school clothes, shoes, sweets and groceries. Her small family was so grateful and happy beyond words. Mom and daughters kept on saying thank you with tears in her eyes, they are so grateful for the support we have given them.

We helped a **Zimbabwean lady, Angeline** with groceries, after Gloria received a message that she has not eaten for 3 days. When we dropped off the groceries for her, she could not stop crying. As we left, she stood with tears in her eyes, hands covering her face, so grateful that we helped her. We received a message saying "thank you so much! Because of Halli Trust I have become a better person that I was before"

Anastacia Maloao - Community Representative in Lwandle/Nomzamo/Zola, assisted the **Mphosi family** in Zola. She helped them with groceries, and we bought new school clothes for the boy. She phoned the office to say thank you so much and Anastacia said they were so grateful for the groceries as they really had nothing in the cupboards to eat and the boy had no school shoes.

Fire Victims

We had lots of fire victims in Smartie Town, Nomzamo, Zola, Sir Lowry's Pass and Lwandle. We were able to help many families with basic household items, clothes and groceries.

With the little we help families, the response of Hope is bigger than we can imagine - it might not be much, but those faces that light up when we hand out those few things to help them rebuild their lives are the greatest blessings for us

School clothes

We were able to buy new school clothes, school shoes and socks for many children. We are super grateful that we can assist children to attend school and feel good in their new school clothes. This is very important to us to help children with school items as we enable a child to attend school to feel proud and confident.

A little girl in the Nomzamo club wrote us a letter about her family, there was no food, nor did she and sister have any school clothes, our Community Representative, Gloria Hungana went and assessed the family and immediately saw the need, we were able to help the family with groceries, school clothes and shoes! They were overjoyed!

Halli Homework Club

We visited a school and one of the learners of this school is in our Homework Club in Nomzamo – the teacher/social worker said to me she can see that homework gets done with the little girl, we were surprised at first and then realized but she is referring to the little girl attending our Homework Club in Nomzamo. **Mandi one of our Homework Club volunteers** is doing such a super job assisting the children with homework. We are so proud of you Mandi!

Halli Club Nomzamo

The children received their green t- shirts for the first time for those who attended 3 Halli Clubs in a row. They were so excited and proud to wear their t-shirts.

Halli Leaders Clubs

We were super excited for the new start of our Halli Leaders Club. They have their own monthly get together. This is to help equip them as the future leaders and nurture them in their own lives

Halli Club ambassador – Aventhandwa has been a great ambassador for Halli Club Nomzamo without anyone knowing about it. She was one of the children who was selected as a new leader because of her age and her constant attendance, yet not knowing she was a true leader already going out beforehand to remind every child in her area that they need to be present at the scheduled Halli Clubs. It's because of her that all the children she called, received attendance certificates. Her aunt's heart was filled with joy when she found out that she was selected as a New Leader

Halli Club goal setter – Luhle Hungana said to Gloria our Community Representative after receiving her Halli Club attendance certificate that in only 2 years' time she will also be chosen to be a leader and she cannot wait for that!!

Homework Club – Mandi Scott has taken the initiative to teach those who could not read and write. She does awesome practices with them

Marshalling for Cape Town Cycle Tour

Most of the people that helps us is our dear friends from the community. We are super grateful for each marshal that's always willing to put their hands up to help us. The team enjoys this so much as most of them has never been in Cape Town of at an event like this.

Needlework Club - Eve and Cheryl made a huge difference with our needlework club ladies. The ladies loved each moment of learning how to make clothes for themselves. The proudness and satisfaction on the faces of these ladies are precious to see each Friday. We were at the brink of cancelling the Needlework Club as there was no mentor and we were struggling to find one.

Just before we made the final decision Lynn Merry stood up and said, "I am here for you, I will be here to mentor these ladies" It has been a great success thus far!

Gloria Hungana and Anastacia Molaoa, our Community Representatives blessed **7 families with food parcels**. They were grateful and in tears when we arrived. We were just in time with the food parcels, in IsiXhosa there's an idiom that says "the cat is sitting on the stove" which means there's no food in the cupboards. Another family's daughter passes out due to not having enough food to eat. We were fortunate enough to have blessed all these families and to put a big smile on their faces as they opened those parcels.

General

Florence Dally – She is 92 years old and after a medical setback she felt that Halli Trust is the only thing that keeps her going and gives her a reason to live. It was her 2nd year this year that she contributed to our Madiba Day Beanie Drive by knitting 67 beanies this past year.

Bridgewater Manor – We did a presentation at Bridgewater Manor Frail Care for the residence, and it was such a special experience, for one, 1 of the residence danced with Halli our Mascot and she couldn't stop dancing, it was so precious to see.

Sarah Merjaneh came all the way from Belgium to experience life in our communities and see what Halli Trust all is about. She enjoyed every second of it!! She loved seeing how the little children danced for her. Sarah says that it really touched her heart and left her speechless to see the work we do.

Pikkewouters school had their Caring Month in May, and they donated all the donations to Halli Trust. We received toiletries, groceries, and soft toys. This is amazing, and such a huge blessing. A big thank you to all those from Pikkewouters School who contributed. We were able to bless so many families.


